BGCA currently provides supervised programming by trained youth development professionals to on-base Clubs around the world. MISSION: Youth Outreach will help increase the range of support to the more than 3,700 off-base Boys & Girls Clubs.

“We have similar values and principles, so a partnership with the Navy and Marine Corps was a natural fit for our organization,” said Jack Ribas, Executive Director of the Boys & Girls Club LNV. “This is just our way of giving something back in return for all that the military gives to America.”

Boys & Girls Clubs of America ([www.bgca.org](http://www.bgca.org)) comprises a national network of some 3,700 neighborhood-based facilities annually serving more than 4.4 million young people, primarily from disadvantaged circumstances. Known as “The Positive Place for Kids,” the Clubs provide guidance-oriented character development programs on a daily basis for children 6-18 years old, conducted by a full-time professional staff. Key Boys & Girls Club programs emphasize character and leadership development, education and career development, health and life skills, the arts, sports, fitness, and recreation.
