**BOYS & GIRLS CLUB ADDS 10<sup>TH</sup> WEEK TO SUMMER CAMP**

**Shelton, CT, May 14, 2009** – The Boys & Girls Club of the Lower Naugatuck Valley has added a 10<sup>th</sup> week to its Summer Fun Club Summer Camp. The camp will now run from June 22<sup>nd</sup> through August 28<sup>th</sup>. Children can attend for one week of camp, all ten weeks, or any combination. The weekly fee is \$150 for 6-12 year olds and \$100 for children 13-15. Additional siblings are \$100 each per week.

Made possible in part by the Fairfield County Community Foundation, camp activities include crafts, sports, games room, computers, outdoor education, contests, and sewing. Weekly trips are available to destinations such as water parks and museums. Children are treated to a barbecue every Friday, followed by a special event such as Club Idol or Wacky Water Day. Children may bring their own snacks and lunch or purchase food from the on-site café. Free breakfast and lunch are available for children who qualify.
